



Safe Spaces for Youth and Young Adults

It can be hard to know where you can go where you won't be judged for being different. In partnership with One Iowa, Homeward and its partners has pulled together the following resources specifically geared toward young people who identify as LGBTQIA+.

<u>lowa Homeless Youth Center's Youth Opportunity Center</u> is a safe space for individuals experiencing homelessness who are between the ages of 16-24. IHYC provides homeless youth services including drop-in, emergency beds, and street outreach to youth living without safe, stable housing. Other programs such as counseling, foster care aftercare, education support, and supportive housing are also available. Follow them on Facebook, Instagram, and Twitter.

Public Libraries are viewed as one of the only free, non-biased government locations where youth and young adults are encouraged to visit. While every library has a different focus, some libraries, such as the Des Moines Public Library, have added social workers to their staff to help connect patrons to community resources through projects such as The Outreach Project.
